## **History of Duck River Garden Club**

I moved to Old Lyme in 1966 from Waterford, CT where I was a member of the Oswegatchie Garden Club. I continued to attend their meetings as Old Lyme did not have a Garden Club and Lyme Garden Club was (at that time) for residents of Lyme only.

In 1969, I decided, with the encouragement of friends, to start a Garden Club in Old Lyme for those interested in gardening, conservation and floral arranging. I invited five friends from different areas in town to a meeting at my home. We decided on a date, time and place for our first meeting.

We met under the name "Old Lyme Garden Club" for almost one year and decided to join The Federated Garden Clubs of Connecticut. Lillian Rathbun, a member of the Lyme Garden Club was the Federation President. In speaking with her, we had no problem joining the State Federation except for our name, Old Lyme Garden Club. The local newspapers confused our name with the Lyme Garden Club giving us publicity when it belonged to them and visa versa. This did not please them as they were an old established club. In order to become federated, we had to change our name.

There were many suggestions, and the majority favored "Duck River Garden Club of Old Lyme". I was the first president 1969-1971. Original logo was by John Colton.
